## **Deadlines and Requirements**

Fall	Provide WRNBC with suggested topic and approximate length of talk
Dec 31	Provide WRNBC with final title and length of talk for promotional materials Provide WRNBC with notice of any presentation requirements (e.g. A/V)
Jan 15	Provide WRNBC with e-copy of any accompanying handouts (optional)*
Jan 31	Provide WRNBC with 200-300 word biography Provide WRNBC with 100 word abstract of your talk

- Free registration for the day of your talk. Should you wish to also attend the remaining day(s) of the symposium, you can register at 50% off of the full weekend member rate.
