Location

Kamloops is a small town located at the northern tip of the Okanagan grasslands. It is situated at the confluence of the North and South Thompson Rivers between hoodoos, sandy shores and a desert landscape. The grasslands surrounding Kamloops are Canada's most endangered ecosystem and are home to over 30% of Canada's endangered species. Kamloops (population 90,000) resides on Secwepemc land is the stop over for travellers between Calgary/Edmonton and Vancouver and skiers heading to Canada's second largest ski resort. While March can be summer in the valley, winter can still be found at Sun Peaks, a 45 minute drive up the mountain. With wildlife at our doorstep, Rocky Mountain Sheep, Elk and Black Bears are found within city limits, and can often be spotted along Shuswap Road which parallels the South Thompson River and the Trans Canada Highway.

Weather

Kamloops boasts the lowest rainfall in Canada. The advantage of grasslands and deserts is the climate, but with clear skies come cool nights as our daytime heat leaves the atmosphere. Average temperatures 7oC/3oC, with the last few years giving us days of 17oC and nights of -3oC. Some years, there is snow remaining and slush everywhere with the warm temperatures. Other years the crocuses are popping out. With this year being a weak La Nina, we may see a bit of snow remaining if the cool air mass reaches far enough south to affect Kamloops. Otherwise, if the cool La Nina temperatures stay in the northern areas of BC, we will see the start of spring time.

Getting Here

If you choose to come by air, there are often deals to be had. All major airlines fly to Kamloops (YKA) and many smaller airlines fly to Kamloops and some only as far as Kelowna YLW airport (1.5hr drive). The airport is not serviced by transit (although they say they are), and transit stops at the community a 15-20 minute walk away. Make sure you pack light if you are taking transit.

Car rentals are available at the airport, although you will be able to get around without a vehicle if you choose to. http://www.kamloopsairport.com/

Arriving by highway, The Trans Canada Highway feeds traffic past the BC Wildlife Park and runs north past all the hotels in Valley View, and continues up the hill to Aberdeen, where more hotels are located. Highway 5 from Valemount connects to highway 1. Kamloops highways are well designed to quickly access the three main regions of the city.

Getting Around

Bus

BC Transit offers public transport to and from downtown to the outskirts. It is a 30-45 minute ride from the BC Wildlife Park to city center, and another 30-50 minutes from city center to outskirt destinations.
